Bringing Israeli STEM Talent Back Home—Now More Than Ever

After a period of extraordinary disruption, Israel's North stands at the threshold of renewal. Nowhere is the opportunity greater than in the waters off our coast. The Mediterranean Sea has always been Israel's greatest natural resource: a place where culture, science, and diplomacy converge.

The University of Haifa is launching a new effort to bring home a rising star in the field of maritime studies to join The Leon Recanati Institute for Maritime Studies (RIMS). What sets RIMS apart is its pioneering, interdisciplinary research into human-maritime encounters, integrating diverse fields from archaeozoology and cyber archaeology to applied marine biology and ecology. This unique approach has established RIMS as a leading institution in Israel and renowned globally for its contributions to the field and collaborative projects.

This appointment will not only advance new underwater excavation projects and strengthen Israel's research ecosystem, but also unlock new possibilities for archaeo-diplomacy. To attract top Israeli researchers, the University of Haifa offers comprehensive support packages:



Competitive Salary — for the first three years, funded by the University and its generous donors.



State-of-the-Art Research
Facilities — with access to
advanced laboratories and
research infrastructure.



Research Funding — consisting of substantial research budgets to support groundbreaking studies and initiatives.

Program Partners

Our Returning Scientists Program is a collaborative initiative involving three key partners: the University of Haifa, Israel's Council for Higher Education, and the Haifa Municipality. The University of Haifa and its donors provide initial funding and laboratory space, ensuring that returning scientists have essential resources to begin their work. After three years, the candidate will become a full faculty member.

The Council for Higher Education contributes funding to attract top-tier researchers. Meanwhile, the Haifa Municipality will offer an attractive absorption package that includes reduced municipal taxes, making it more appealing for scientists to settle in the city. Together, these partners create a robust support system to facilitate the successful reintegration of returning scientists into northern Israel's scientific community.
