Give the gift of scholarships

Student scholarships are a driving force behind the University of Haifa's success. They represent a key investment in the academic future of Israel and in meeting the social, cultural and technological challenges that lie ahead.

As Israel's most pluralistic academic institution, the University of Haifa is committed to closing the social, educational and economic gaps that exist within Israeli society. Since its founding more than 40 years ago, the University has been dedicated to making the goal of higher education accessible to all. *Each year, the University awards more than \$7 million in tuition assistance*, helping to support the academic and professional dreams of talented and committed students from the full spectrum of Israeli society.



Bright and needy students

In keeping with its commitment to providing education to the best and brightest, the University of Haifa is opening doors for students from low-income families, by providing financial aid for those who need it most. Our diverse scholarship programs and pioneering academic and leadership projects for students of different ethnic, religious and socioeconomic backgrounds have become successful models for empowerment and promoting equal opportunities.

As part of our commitment to academic excellence and seeking ***the best and brightest students*** for graduate studies, two-thirds of the University's scholarship budget is allocated to students in graduate programs.

Soldiers

The Scholarship Fund for Soldiers is designed to show appreciation to the young men and women who have served the State of Israel and provided security to citizens and tourist alike. Priority will be given to combat and combat-support soldiers and outstanding students who come from Israel's peripheral areas, low-income families and/or disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds. Recipients will be selected based on the University of Haifa scholarship criteria and must maintain satisfactory academic progress.

Minority students

Minority populations in Israel face tremendous challenges. A majority of these students come from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds. While academic scholarships provide a necessary foundation for their participation in higher level education, these scholarships alone are insufficient to ensuring academic and professional success. Once they begin their studies, minority students

require a more holistic support system to thrive and excel. Many of these students are the first-generation in their family to pursue higher education degrees.

These students require additional support to secure housing in the campus dormitories, textbooks, and additional scholarship support to pay for food services at the University.

Advanced studies

The President's Scholarships for Success Program, a fellowship program for doctoral students, provides academic scholarship support and living expenses over a four year period. The current cohort of 1,000 doctoral candidates – among them, tomorrow's faculty luminaries – engages in cutting-edge research while mentoring new students.

The doctoral scholarships are a particularly critical element in the University's strategic vision for the future of Israeli academic leadership. A strong doctoral scholarship program aims to reverse the "brain drain" of talented scientists and scholars who leave Israeli institutions for doctoral and post-graduate studies abroad, ultimately pursuing careers outside the country. By offering doctoral scholarships, the University will offer these doctoral candidates the opportunity to make lives for themselves and their families in Israel, while supporting the development of Israel's academic, business, and military sectors.
