


## **Shaping Tomorrow's Jewish Leaders**

## **Academic Leadership**



Prof. Hillel Newman (PhD Hebrew University), who serves as Department Chair, is a leading scholar in Jewish civilization of Late Antiquity. A Harvard alumnus, his expertise spans rabbinic

literature, Jewish-Christian relations and polemics, and apocalyptic writings of Jews and Christians during the Roman-Byzantine era. Prof. Newman's acclaimed research illuminates the rich diversity of Jewish thought and experience in this pivotal period, shaped by interactions with majority cultures.

#### **Our Students**

Our Israeli students bring a rich tapestry of experiences and backgrounds, shaping a vibrant learning community. A painter uses Jewish texts to inspire her work. A disabled IDF veteran finds academic studies a rehabilitation tool. Several students work as tour guides, deepening their understanding of spiritual and cultural heritage. Even a law student finds Jewish legal traditions enriching her legal education, offering fresh angles on ethics and morality.
